Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's eighth season we were able to field nine junior teams: two in the under 8 age group and one each in the Under 17, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10 and 9 age groups, four mini teams, two in the under 6 and two in the under 7 age groups, and four senior teams in the Raahauge Cup competition – a total of 18 teams. This is the same number of teams fielded in 2005 but an increase in overall player numbers. Our satellite club at Newington grew an extra two teams this year to field three mini teams and two junior sides.

In 2006 we continued to utilise both Granville and Everley Parks. Granville Park is terrific for players and parents due to its proximity to most our players' homes, but our canteen always does much less business at Granville which is costly for the club. Our canteen makes significantly less money at Granville Park and the line marking is a club expense (rather than at Everley where the generosity of time given by Mr Peter Sampson in marking the lines is much appreciated). In 2006 we only gained one additional sponsor in John R Turk's renewing their support however, the sponsorship of Shalala Smash Repairs and Wipeout Pest Control remained current from last season. We thank all these businesses for their kind support. There is a page further on in this report where they are further acknowledged and I would encourage you to support these businesses. Make sure you mention McCredie Soccer when you do!!

Again we welcomed some new coaches and managers this year as well as welcoming back some returning coaches. We did have one notable retirement from Sam Eid who did not coach in 2006. Thanks Sam for all your work with the boys (under 8 to under 10) and we hope to renew your involvement with the club when your house is complete! Robert French also did not coach his own team in 2006

(having guided the 17s since they were 10 in 1999) but his assistance in stepping in with at least three separate sides during the year when required was invaluable and much appreciated.

In 2006 the committee was again unchanged. Peter and Dorothy's efforts in organising the canteen, printing and distributing the newsletter, ensuring the fields are set up and packed up and generally doing anything and everything as required keeps this club going. Too often they are taken for granted and it is deeply disappointing to see Peter pulling down nets and mini posts at the end of a long Saturday morning when I know he has spent from the early hours warming sausage rolls at home, packing his van with equipment, selling food and dealing with spectators as the ground official. Don't forget this family has also printed and distributed the newsletters and their son was injured (and has since retired from playing) before the halfway point of the season!

Thanks also to the Thomson family for the time they spend keeping the 'books' for the club and to Carolynne Wark for all her efforts as registrar, ensuring all the paperwork is up to date and bills paid. Chris Goringe would be totally unknown to almost all club members, but anybody who has visited the club website has seen his handy work. Thanks Chris.

Again in 2006 we enjoyed some strong results. Our RCN 1sts, 14s, and 11s were premiers whilst the 12s, 10s and 9s were runners up. We won five knockouts the 9s, 10s, 11s, 13s and 14s which was amazing and the 14s also won the President's Cup. (This is the 4th successive year that we have won the under 14 President's Cup, certainly something for this year's 13s to aspire to next year!). All this in a year when the six a side was washed out – oh what might have been!

We had some significant injuries this year and I am pleased to report that all the players are on the mend. Never have I experienced a season for injuries quite like this one. We had three broken legs (myself, Peter Hession and Kari Bergsson), Iain Houlford broke his jaw and cheek and three players required knee surgery (Ian Warwick – second year in a row, Carlos Calderon and Moises Palacios). Amongst this lot were 4 coaches! Let's hope we've used up all our injuries for a few years! It is a credit to our club's depth that despite these injuries three of our four senior teams made the semis.

The NSWCFA continues to offer our players these opportunities, knockouts, night matches (for U13s and older), President's Cup and six a side (when it doesn't flood for a week!) in addition to the regular competition. These additional competitions are not offered by other Associations and are always very much missed by players who have experienced them and left to play elsewhere. The cancellation of the six a side was a bitter disappointment. Those who have played it know what I mean, those who haven't will just have to believe me when I say that we all missed the best weekend of the season in June when it poured for a week. The Association recognises this and is putting a plan in place so that should rain again interfere in June, the competition can take place at another time. (Apart from the fun, our club usually makes about \$2000 in canteen profits which of course this year we missed out on).

Our website continued to be well patronised in 2006. We have made some new additions including lists of Association records and links to the laws. Our Association has a history going back to 1929, have a look at the records (since '76) as you are now part of that history. The Association's website was also overhauled this year and included competition tables and draws etc. We would like to be able to add more pictures to the site but we are restricted a little by Child Protection legislation. We will though attempt to get some more up to date photos and things up next year by gaining parental permission and uploading them.

The diversity of cultures in our club has always been a sense of great pride for us. Here is a list of cultures that have been represented at McCredie: Aboriginal, Afghanistan, Argentina, Armenia, Bulgaria, Chile, China, Congo, Cook Islands, Costa Rica, Croatia, Egypt, El Salvador, England, Fiji, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Ireland, Irian Jaya, Italy, Kosovo, Kuwait, Lebanon, Liberia, Macedonia, Malta, Mexico, Nepal, New Zealand, Palestine, Peru, Kurdestan, Philippines, Samoa, Serbia, Sierra Leone, Slovakia, Somalia, Sweden, Turkey, USA, Uzbekistan and Vietnam. This year we added Belgium, Thailand and Sudan. Have we missed yours?

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. We will also be taking preliminary registrations at the Presentation Day. You can register any time by seeing me but remember no registration will be accepted without a \$20.00 deposit. Please register early as I would hate anybody to miss out. Be aware however: registering with our club means you are making a commitment, you are in fact signing a contract to play soccer with our club. We will honour that contract by providing soccer, you by playing.

Thanks again for a terrific 2006 and I look forward to enjoying our fine community together with you again in 2007.


Zion Woetai



Pablo demonstrated good skills and an ability to dribble past opposing players, something we probably didn't make the best use of. We know Pablo better now and I look forward to utilising his talents more effectively next year.

Bilal Toklar certainly had me worried at our first training runs. Bil didn't like laps, tried to get out of ball work and generally didn't train well. It was only the second or third session though when he approached me and thanked me for pushing him along that I knew we were on to a winner here. Bil is a very courageous player, always wins a 50/50 ball and plays well above himself week after week. One of our most important defenders.

Lukman Sungkar never played the same position for two games in a row. Very quick on his feet, quick thinking and cooperative, Luk was invaluable plugging gaps, marking opposition danger men and helping out when a team mate was finding his position difficult on the day.

Wol Reec is the last of our new boys. We tried Wol up front to start and he made an immediate impact against Granville. Eventually though he settled in to central midfield where his wiry frame enabled him to disrupt opposition playmakers, by reaching in, dispossessing them and either taking on defenders or distributing the ball.

Nawab Rezayee returned to us this year after a year away and had a fantastic year. Whether up front bashing opposition fullbacks out of the way and scoring or feeding Caner, or in sweeper organising the defence and bashing their strikers, Nawab was a powerful player. Nawab's ball skills are as good as anyone in the teams and his body strength and his ability to use it is number 1.

Dylan Trevor also had his third year with the side this year and is certainly the heart and soul of the midfield. Dylan sets up attacks and when we lose the ball he is defending fiercely. Dylan doesn't like losing anything and his determination is one of his greatest strengths as he never gives an inch. By season's end his combination with Wol was really starting to develop nicely.

The rest of the side has been together since 2000 or earlier and have developed a very good knowledge of each others games and how to get the best out of each other.

Steven Ghadieh had a positional change this season moving from stopper out to right back. Steven took his speed and ability to tackle to the position but also a knowledge of working as a defensive unit and what is required from the flanks by the guys in the middle. It sounds a bit complex but Steven worked very well with the guys defending inside him and made a huge difference. Steven's game improved this year as much as anyone's in the team, and he was already good when he started!

Toufic Haddad again impressed everybody with his ability to read a game, predict where the ball will be and be there before anyone else, despite the fact that he is not super quick. That said, soccer is about being quick over ten yards, not fifty, and Toufic is not slow over ten. Toufic moved from sweeper to stopper to accommodate Nawab and continued to be our best natural defender. His friendship with Steven (which is a nightmare at training) is very important on a Saturday and the two continued to work well together across the back.

Mat Biber took a while to get going this year. Getting used to the pace and size of his opponents was a challenge Mat took on eagerly. The second round saw Mat put in a couple of man of the match performances in the halves which were cruelly cut short by a shoulder injury which prematurely ended his season. With the team since '99 we know Mat will bounce back though.

Cem Tekirdag started the season with two goals in the opening match and we thought here we go, Cem's big year! A broken arm, followed by another arm injury disrupted his season and our potency up front. Cem and Caner play well together though and this should continue to be the case in '07.

Patrick Ajnas has always been one of our most reliable and 2006 proved no different. Pat played most the season, as he has the 7 before, at centre half. This changed by season's end to accommodate Wol's move and Pat played very well at stopper, elsewhere in the backline or wide in the halves. Pat even played in goals where he started in the 8s! No matter where he plays Pat always follows instructions perfectly.

Caner Temel is our attack. There is no simpler or more accurate way of putting it. We all try and give Caner the ball in the best position for him to score, we know that and, unfortunately, so do our opposition. Caner breaks down weak or flat back defences with ease. A challenge for the whole team is breaking down stronger sides' defences and defences which play more deeply. This is our challenge in 2007.

The boys and their parents are very understanding that I can't be in two places at once and I thank them for that. A special thanks to **Corinda** for her assistance as team manager and **Gaven**'s assistance with coaching on Saturdays, it is much appreciated and I look forward to spending next season with you both and the boys again.




