## Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's ninth season we were able to field eleven junior teams: two in the under 9 age group and one each in the Under 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10 and 8 age groups, four mini teams, two in the under 6 and two in the under 7 age groups, and six senior teams in the Raahauge Cup competition – a total of 21 teams. This is an increase in the number of teams fielded in 2006 and in fact the most teams McCredie has ever entered into competition. Our satellite club at Newington grew an extra team too, to field three mini teams and three junior sides.

2007 probably saw us move from being the little local club, seeing as we are now larger than most our neighbouring clubs, but we continue to attempt to offer the same community feel and personal service we have always offered. It is however, becoming increasingly difficult and whilst I personally continue to attempt to know every player's name, 20 phone calls on a Saturday morning (or 11.30pm on a week night) from players to ask a question is difficult to continue to deal with. As I wrote in a newsletter early in the year, we want to continue to help but some consideration is necessary from the club members.

Again we welcomed some new coaches and managers this year as well but more than any year before we really relied on returning coaches and managers as our team numbers swelled. We did have some unsatisfactory arrangements with a couple of sides taking a while to find a coach or having coaches regularly working on Saturdays or training nights. We also had teams where coaches couldn't be present because they were involved with multiple teams. This all of course occurs because only a few are prepared to make the sacrifices necessary to take on positions of responsibility. Please think where you may be able to help out next year and a huge thankyou to all those who already make these commitments.

In 2007 there was one change to the committee with Brendan Deppi stepping down from Club Councillor following his move to Camden and Philip Rafter stepping in to attend the monthly Association meetings. Peter and Dorothy continued in their outstanding contributions to the canteen, newsletter, field set up, equipment maintenance and just about anything else. Thanks also to the Thomson family for the time they spend keeping the 'books' for the club and to Carolynne Wark for all her efforts as registrar, ensuring all the paperwork is up to date and bills paid.

Again in 2007 we enjoyed some strong results. Our under 16s and 13s were premiers and both our under 6s were undefeated, whilst the Raahauge Cup North Reserves, 12s and 11s were runners up. We won four knockouts the 16s, 13s, 12s and 11s (with the 10s and Youth as runners up) and the under 11s, 12s and 13s also won their President Cups. Unfortunately the six a side was washed out again in June almost certainly denying some teams more trophies although the replaying of the mini six a side competition in August did allow the 6 whites and 7 whites the opportunity to finish as runners up (both losing on corners in extra time).

Our website continued to be well patronised in 2007 and email communication has become very important. It is more important than ever to give the club your email address if you want up to the minute information. We have made some new additions including lists of Association records and links to the laws. Our Association has a history going back to 1929, have a look at the records (since '62) as you are now part of that history.

The diversity of cultures in our club has always been a sense of great pride for us.
