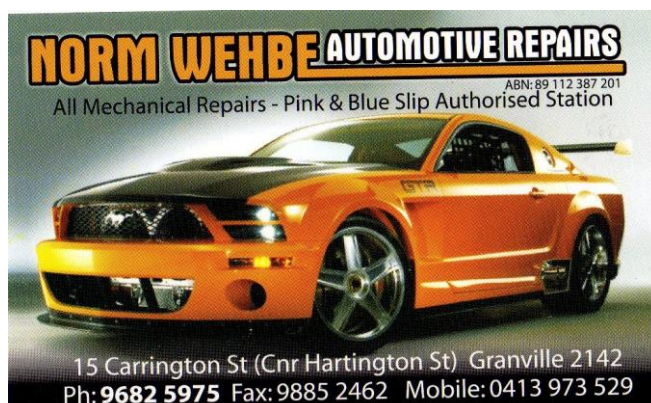

Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's eleventh season we were able to field nine junior teams: one each in the Under 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9 and 8 age groups, three mini teams, one in the under 6 and two in the under 7 age groups, and five senior teams, three in the Raahauge Cup competition and two in Premier League – a total of 17 teams. This is steady on the number of teams fielded in 2008, but a significant increase in player numbers (in 2008 the under 17s also played senior soccer, adding a team but not players, and we fielded one less mini team (9 players) and an additional senior team (15 players) this year).

2009 also saw the Newington Gunners separate formally from Guildford McCredie and incorporate as a club in their own right. They too continued to grow in 2009 and we wish them all the best for a long and successful future.

This year, like in 2006 and 2008, we entered some older junior teams into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. This decision was taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the NSWCFCA. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided.

Again registrations were well supported and again teams filled quickly. Unfortunately some long term players had to be turned away as they attempted to register after the team was filled. In 2008 we closed teams and turned many away. In 2009 we attempted to grow some extra sides in the more popular ages, but were frustrated when we got numbers like 19 players. Not enough to create a second team, too many for a single team, we tried everything to satisfy everyone, but this often proves to be an impossible task. All I can advise is to register early and agree to be placed where club executive recommends. Nobody who registered on the first Saturday in February, and agreed to play in the team in which they were placed, missed out.

I have to mention the weather. Appalling! With Granville Park closed for all but one Wednesday in 7 weeks, training was seriously interrupted. Some of our youngest teams lost momentum and players at this time, and whilst the club was powerless to do anything, many parents seemed to think it was our fault. We also had 4 coaches move overseas or to the country during the season and it was a real effort at times to ensure all teams were looked after. There is no question that we need more commitment from parents to step into roles. The senior players (and two under 16s) actually coached and managed 6 of our junior sides. That's nice but it also means plenty of spare parents.

We again had some successful sides in 2009 but it was certainly the toughest year we have had for a while. This is due to 2008's extraordinary success and numerous teams being promoted in 2009 on the back of that success. The under 14s, 15s, 16s, Raahauge Cup 1sts and Premier League were all promoted in 2009. They should all be congratulated for their efforts and for those teams that were less successful, remember that your sides are almost all stronger than in 2008 – it's just that the competition was too. Some sides may have a much more successful 2010 to look forward to.

Our only 'win' was the under 9s who secured the Knockout Championship. Well done. At the time I wrote in the newsletter that the club had won our "first trophy for the season". Little did I know that that would be our only trophy! Congrats and commiserations to the under 15s and Premier reserves who were both minor premiers but missed out on proceeding to their respective grand finals.

We had some changes to the 2009 committee with Peter Warwick being appointed President by the club's executive and Tom List being elected Club Coach and Robert French as Assistant Secretary at the AGM. Carl Mower was also elected as Fundraising Coordinator at the AGM but found a new job at Coffs Harbour shortly after. Claudia Tiller has filled the role wonderfully since Carl's departure. Peter and Dorothy continued in their outstanding contributions to the canteen, newsletter printing, field set up, equipment maintenance and just about anything else. Thanks also to the Thomson family for the time they spend keeping the 'books' for the club, to Carolynne Wark for all her efforts as registrar, ensuring all the paperwork is up to date and bills paid, Iain Warwick for attending the GDSFA meetings and to Philip Rafter for keeping me company at the monthly NSWCFCA council meetings. Could I also thank Wil Wark, who types the newsletter each week and sends all the results in to the Associations each Saturday.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. Thanks again for a terrific 2009 and I look forward to enjoying our fine community together with you again in 2010.
