## Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's thirteenth season we were able to field four junior teams: one each in the Under 13, 12, 11 and 10 age groups; three small sided teams: two under 9 and an under 8; three mini teams, one in the under 6 and two in the under 7 age groups, and two senior teams in the Raahauge Cup competition – a total of 12 teams. This is a decrease on the number of teams fielded in 2010, with the loss of a senior team and our under 17s, 16s and 14s (but an additional under 10 team was entered).

Losing the teams in our teenage years was very disappointing and surprising. These teams in some ways were victims of their success, with key players achieving selection in representative teams and some players who intended to return, leaving their runs too late. We actually had the very unfortunate situation of players expecting to walk into their sides in March calling to register after we had had to cancel the team. It is however pleasing to have former junior players maintaining their connection to the club by joining the refereeing ranks (Jesse Skiller, Wil Wark and Dean Docker) and coaching (Dean again).

On the positive side, it was very nice to be able to provide teams for each age group between 6 and 13 – with no 'gaps'. The under 10s in particular would have enjoyed playing against boys their own age and hopefully a few new players next year will stop them needing to borrow younger players each week to fill the team.

Again we entered our older junior teams into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. These decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided.

We again had some successful sides in 2011. Our first success was very unexpected. Our under 14s returned for the one off Kings Sevens tournament in May. Almost all these boys began their soccer with McCredie before heading off to various representative teams, but all were excited to be able to represent their 'club of origin' on that day – going through the tournament undefeated. A few weeks later at the Under 10 six a side, we entered two sides and had the thrill of seeing them both qualify for the final.

In the competition proper the under 9 Reds were premiers winning the A Division. A tremendous result and the first time the NSWCFCA has run an A Division since 1982. The under 11s also finished premiers winning their competition undefeated. The Under 12s were minor premiers of the GDSFA Div 5 competition. The improvement this team has shown over the last 5 years is remarkable and a credit to the players and coaches. At the season ending President's Cup we had 4 teams qualify: the 11s, 9 Reds and 9 Whites and the 8s. The 8s went down in the final, while the 11s and 9 Reds were both President's Cup champions for 2011.

Congratulations also to Dylan Trevor who was selected in the NSWCFCA team to compete at the National Christian Football Tiles in New Zealand in October. Dylan has played with our club since 2004 (U13s) and has since won both Junior (2005) and senior (2008) Player of the Year awards. We wish him and the team all the best and look forward to this added experience being brought back to our senior teams in 2012.

The club's executive was elected in November but unfortunately we were unable to fill all positions. The fundraising coordinator's role remain unfilled and is a very important role that will need to be occupied in 2012 to ensure the ongoing success of our club. I would like to thank my fellow committee members, Peter, Dorothy, Carolynne, Tom, Ian, Frank, Robert and Phil for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

In 2012 we are planning to have McCredie enter our first Ladies team. To start this off we have already entered two sides into the Prospect 6 a side competition over summer. Please contact me if you are interested in taking part in the winter season in 2012.

Like last year McCredie will enter senior sides in the NSWCFCA Summer Comp (changing from 7 to 6 a side for this summer). The boys who took part (2 teams: Youth and Oldies) in 2010 reported that fun was had by all.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. Thanks again for a terrific 2011 and I look forward to spending more time next year with the fabulous members of our McCredie community.

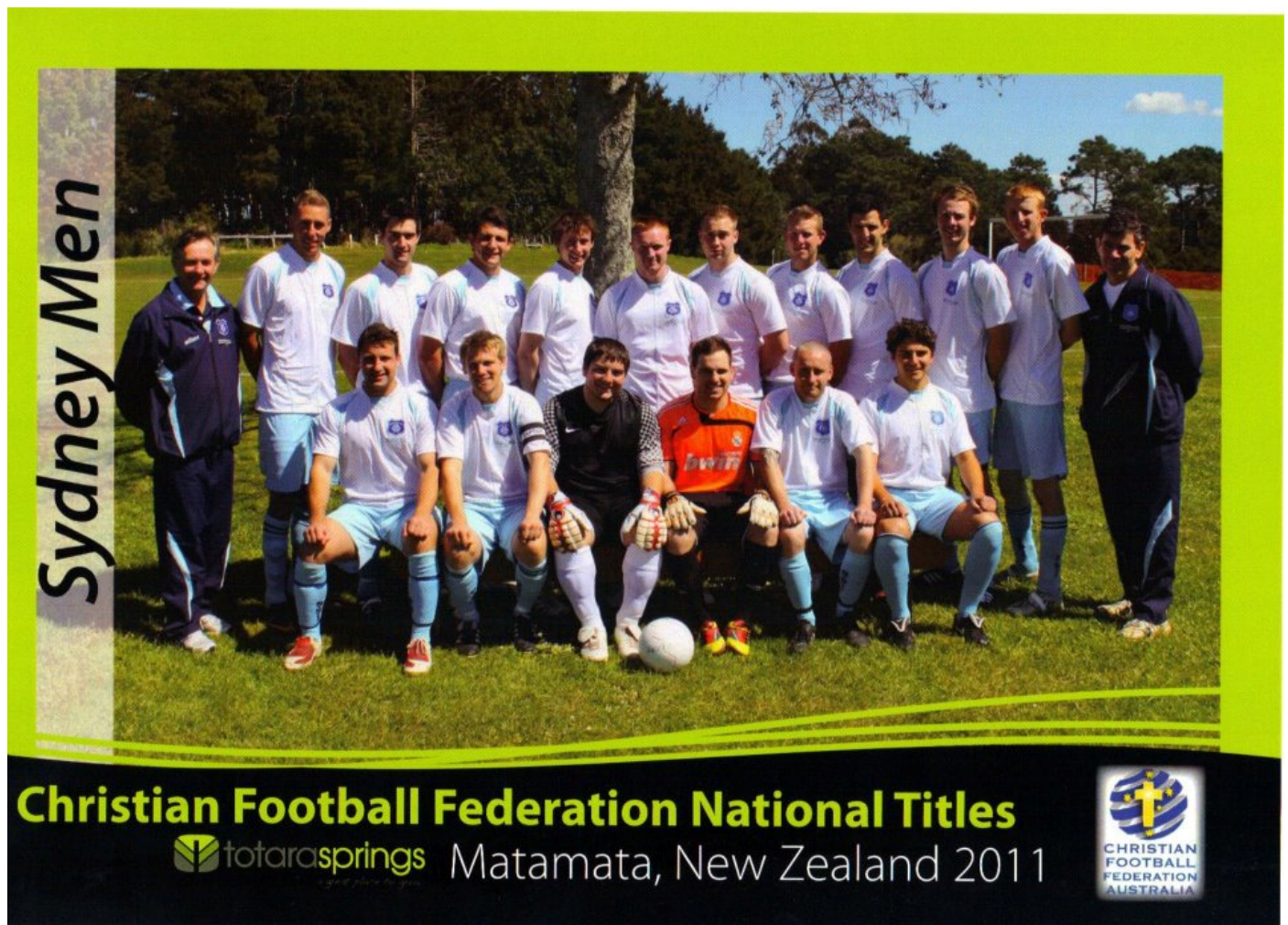
The Christian Football Federation of Australia held its 2011 National Titles in New Zealand over the October Long Weekend.

The tournament involved teams in Senior Mens, Senior Womens, and under 18's Boys. NSWCFA entered a team in the Senior Mens. Teams for the Senior Mens came from Sydney, NSW, Queensland, Victoria and Western Australia. All teams were evenly matched and very strong.

After finishing second in the rounds Sydney played NSW in the semi finals. Sydney led 2-0 at half time, but NSW equalised late in the game to draw 2-2 and the match went to penalties. Sydney won the penalty shoot out 4-3 after Danny Bouzas made two outstanding saves.

In the Final Sydney played WA and again established a lead, up 3-0 at half time. But two early goals in the second half to WA meant some nervous times for those on and off the pitch. Sydney held on and a late goal and a penalty save from Josh Flamminio saw Sydney win the Final 4-2 against a strong opponent.
