Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's fifteenth season we were able to field five junior teams: one each in the Under 15, 13, 12, 11 and 10 age groups; two small sided teams: an under 8 and an under 9; four mini teams, two under 7s and two under 6s; four senior teams in the Raahauge Cup competition and an All Age Ladies team – a total of 16 teams. This is an increase on the number of teams fielded in 2012.

The club purchased some banners which were hung in strategic positions prior to registration and which attracted players immediately. Newspaper and school advertising continued although the cost of newspaper advertising and the limited response suggests that this may be an area not worth pursuing for 2014. The growth in player and team numbers is very pleasing and reward to a committee committed to growing the club.

Again we entered our older junior teams and Ladies into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. These decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided.

We again had some successful sides in 2013 with the Under 11 and Raahauge Cup first Division reserves being competition premiers and the under 10s runners up. The under 11s and 10s were also both runners up in the President's Cup. In the knockout the under 8s were champions and at the six a side the u7 whites and 11s were champions. Our under 16 invitational team also took out the Kings Sevens tournament. All of our junior teams got close though, all qualifying for the President's Cup and almost all competing in knockout or six a side finals (or both).

Zone representative matches for the younger players took place again in 2013 and we had numerous representatives – congratulations to Ali Fahme, Samuel Kidane, Matthew Youssef, Mase Swalah McDahrou, Mustafa Fahme, Christian Frangie, Aaran Batth, Yunus Jamil, Ryan Booker, Angus Wall, Jude Wall, Mounir Hadid, Shaleen Nagar, Jamal Swalah McDahrou, Qais Sungkar, Joe Azzi, Yusuf Jamil, Andrew Ibraheem, Joshua El Kerr and Nedim Fazlic on their selection.


In 2013 the National Titles for 14s, 16s and 18s were held in Perth and the all age men on the Sunshine Coast and McCredie was represented in the NSW City sides by Joel Booker, Jacob Mitwali, Salem Boustany, Matthew Richards and Kabin Rana (14s) and William Wark (16s). Next year Sydney will host the event which should be very exciting. Congratulations too to Martin Lo (Raahauge Cup squad 2012 and McCredie junior) who played in a number of pre season trial matches for the Western Sydney Wanderers in Australia and on their Asian tour and to Mark Cindric who also played in one trial match. Both Martin and Mark started their soccer careers with McCredie.

The club's executive was elected in November but unfortunately we were unable to fill all positions. The fundraising coordinator's role remain unfilled for the third year running and needs filling in 2014. We did welcome Ania Lucewicz and Peter Sultana onto the committee and both made valuable contributions. I would like to thank all the committee, Peter, Dorothy, Carolynne, Darren, Ian, Frank, Peter and Ania for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. Looking forward to catching up with you all again in 2014!

The team of 2013 comprised of four young girls, two of which had never played soccer before and five young boys, four of which have never played soccer before. Unfortunately on both occasions the team was unlucky to lose 3 goals to 2.

Looking back at the year the results for the team are as follows;

Sebastian Kerr

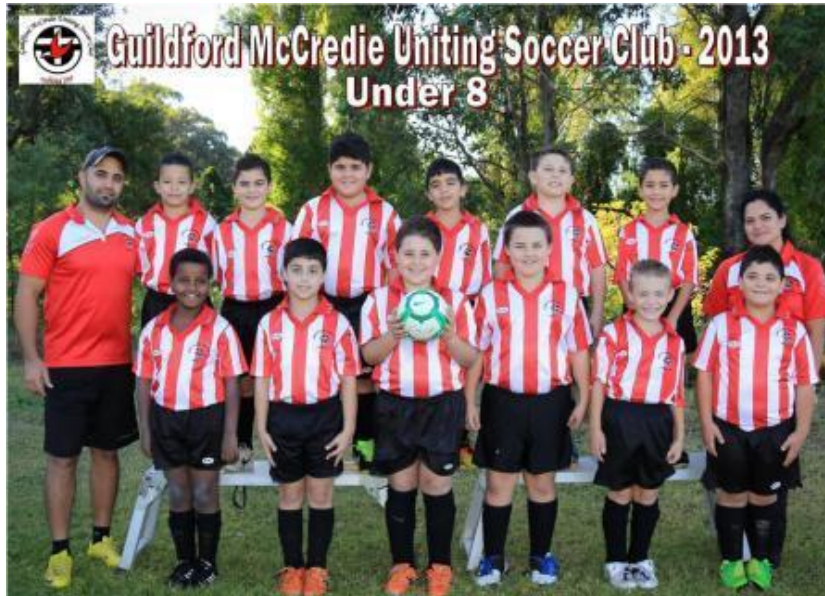

Under 11 Team Report



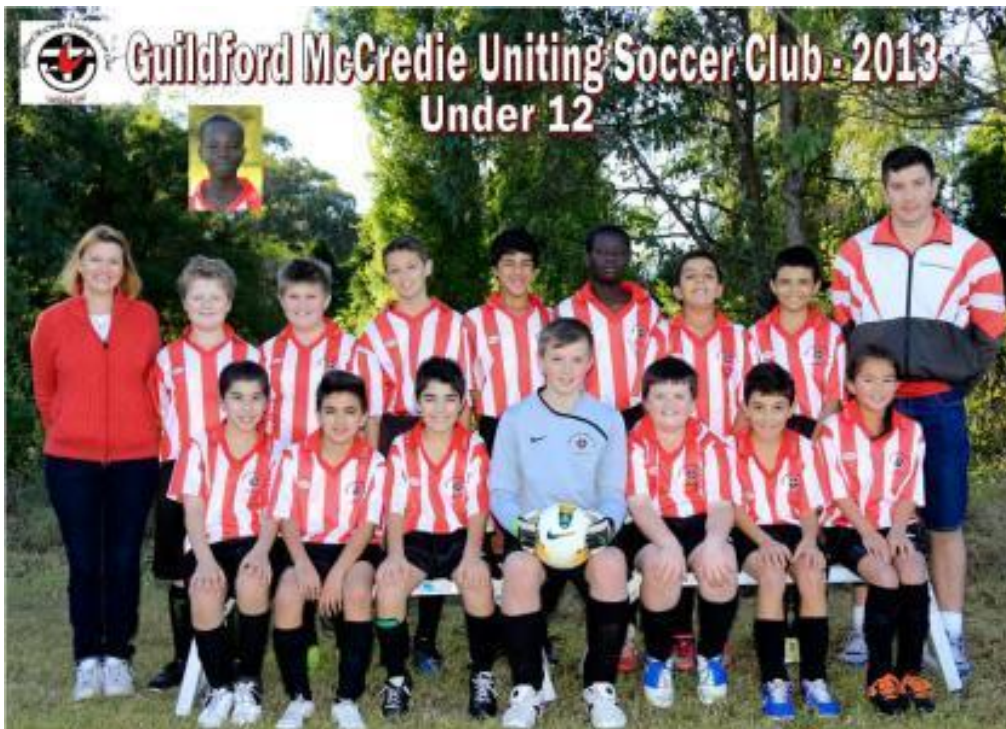

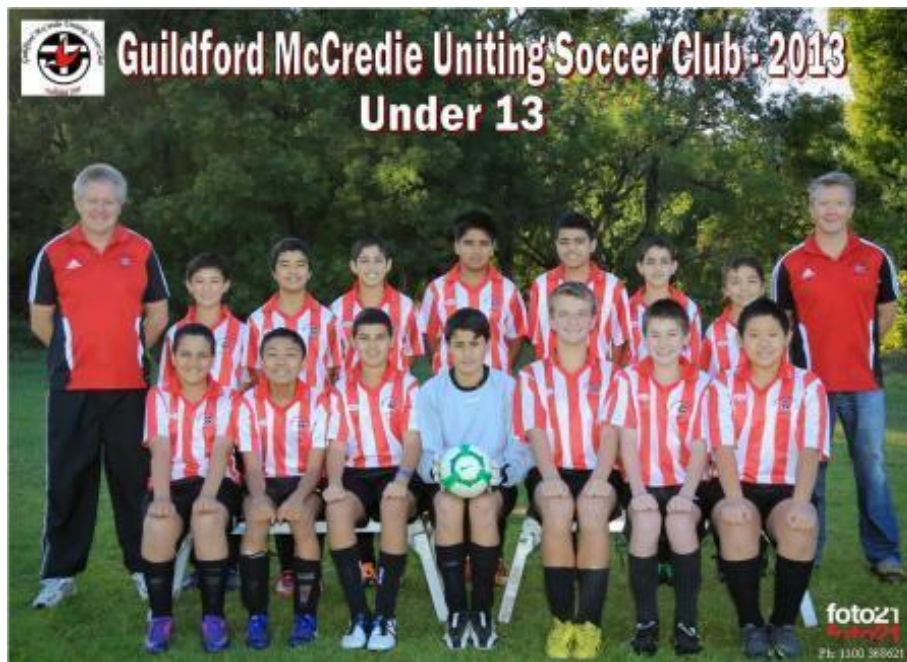
