I watched many of the games and I'm sure that every one of our players thoroughly enjoyed the experience. Next year the National Titles will be held in Queensland.

In closing I would like to thank all our coaches and managers for their fantastic efforts this year and thankyou to all the parents, relatives and supporters who regularly attended the games each week to support their teams.

I hope you all enjoyed the 2017 season as much as I did and I expect to see you all again next year.

Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's nineteenth season we were able to field six junior teams: one each in the Under 16, 13, 12, and 11 age groups and two in the under 14 age group; four small sided teams: two under 9s, an under 10 and an under 8; six mini teams, four under 7s and two under 6s; five senior men's teams (reduced to four mid season) in the Premier League, Sydney Cup and Challenge Cup competitions and an All Age Ladies team – a total of 22 teams. This is an equivalent number of teams to our 2016 numbers, a growth in the younger ages, but an overall slight decrease in player numbers.

Again we entered our older junior teams and Ladies into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior mens' teams continued their affiliation with the New South Wales Churches Football Association. GDSFA subsequently joined the Ladies competition with Blacktown. Decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided. In 2017 CFA Sydney decided to convert the under 10 competition to a small sided format, and this was well received by teams and clubs alike. Unfortunately both GDSFA and CFA Sydney saw a decline in team numbers affecting competition in some ages. Happily our club and some of our neighbours continue to buck this trend demonstrating that the product itself is not the problem but rather the lack of willing volunteers at some clubs and the disloyalty of some of the exiting clubs.

2017 saw us grow our mini numbers to be bigger than we have ever had before. This is great news as our club looks toward the future. Four under 7 teams was a very happy surprise and especially given the success of the newest of them – the mighty U7 Greys. We also were able to add senior teams this season after a decline last year. Getting the two squads (four teams) was very helpful, but we overstretched with the 5th side which was a failure, needing to withdraw mid season, with the reliable, loyal members being moved from the Challenge Cup side into Sydney Cup. Premier League again performed well, finishing second on the table. Multiple crucial injuries cruelled them really and seeing how close they got to both of the grand finalists in the semis illustrates how likely it is that they would have beaten them at full strength. This remains the one trophy that eludes us.

The season got off to a very rocky start with Sydney's worst weather since 1989. Multiple trainings were washed out, all trial games and then in a very bitter blow – so was the six a side tournament. Given that our canteen can take nearly \$5000 across those four days and this was very unfortunate indeed. Add to that the vandalism that occurred over the off season with our fridge, freezer and pie oven needing replacement, and we were behind the eight ball from the start. This, no doubt, will all be reflected in the financial statement.

We maintained some very successful teams in 2017 with our U11s defending last year's trophy being minor premiers and going on to win their grand final and the U12s being minor premiers. The Premier League boys defended their hard won State Cup which was a great achievement. The U7 Whites were runners up in the knockout and the U14s managed to win the prestigious Kings Sevens Title in July, the second year in a row that our club has won the U14 Kings Sevens Trophy.

In 2017 the National Titles for 14s, 16s, 18s, 16s Girls, 23s, AAL and AAM were hosted by NSW CFA and McCredie was represented in the NSW City sides by Abdul Jalloh, Jackson Galea, Aakrist Nepal and Mounir Hadid (U14), Mahmoud Jalloh & Jakob Kaihea (16s), Sharlene Muru-Tucker (16s Girls), Mohamed Rahimi & Angus Chance (AAM), Jenna Nowlan, Natasha Muru Tucker and Rana Karakus (AAL) and Dorothy Warwick (manager AAL) & Natasha Muru Tucker (manager U16 Girls). Congratulations to all. William Wark was also selected in the AAM team only to be subsequently ruled out with injury. The club's executive was elected in November and I would like to thank all the committee, Peter, Dorothy,Carolynne, Phil, Ian, Hendrika, Sarah, Elise and Wil for the support and work they did during a year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. If everybody brings a friend we will double our team numbers! See you all in 2018.

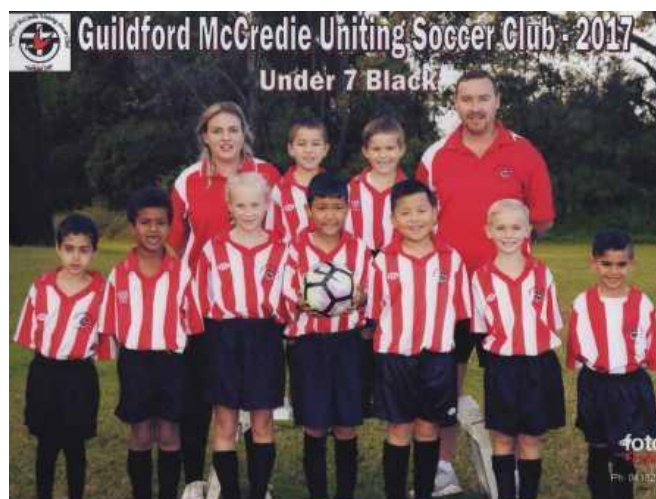

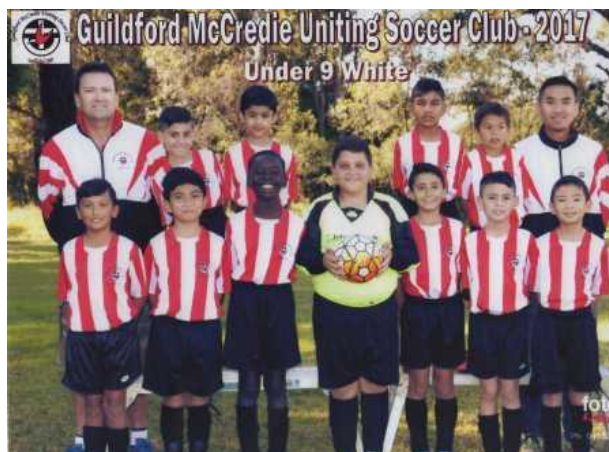
Finally, allow me to thank the wonderful mums and dads I met this season, a group of beautiful dedicated people showing love and support for their children's passion.

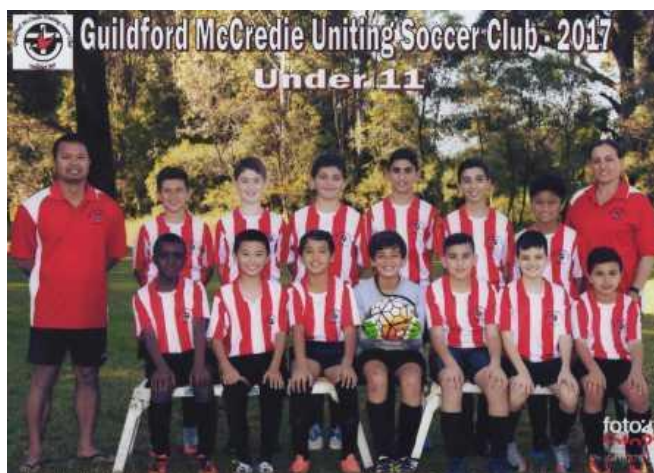

Another member new to the team but not to the club. He always plays his hardest and did a great job at keeping the ball and passing it around to the team. You have shown so much improvement and skill.

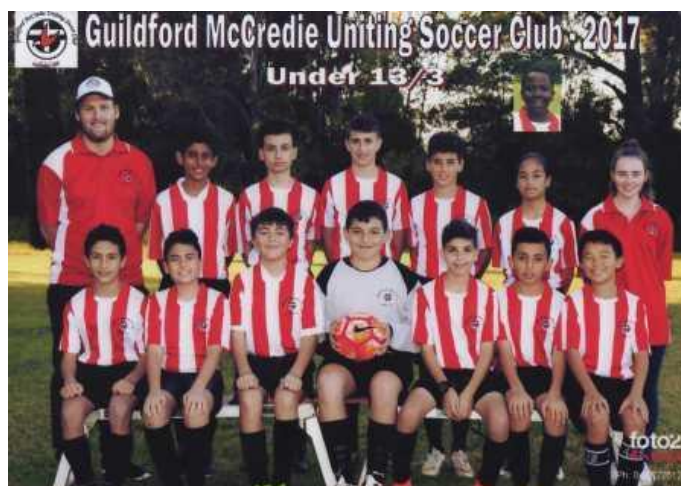
Makuac Kuol: Position – forward

Thank you to all the parents for the support, the laughs, the banter but more importantly, the passion.

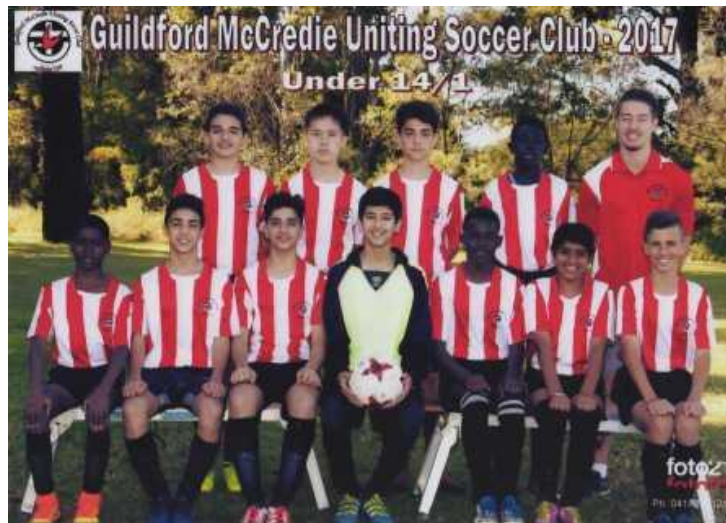
