Secretary's Report

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's twenty first season we were able to field nine junior teams: two each in the Under 11, 13 and 16 age groups and one Under 12, 12 Girls and 15; seven small sided teams: two under 8s, three under 9s, an under 10 and an U9-11 Girls; four mini teams, two under 6s and two under 7s; four senior men's teams in the Premier League and Raahauge Cup competitions and an All Age Ladies team – a total of 25 teams. This is the same number of teams as last season (and equal to the most teams that we have ever fielded) but is an increase on player numbers to last season as we have more 11 a side teams playing.

It was exciting to be able to enter another junior girls team this season after our successful U11s last year. With both teams qualifying for Grand Finals we seem to have been successful again. Hopefully we can continue to expand our junior girls programs. Again we entered our older junior teams and Ladies into the competitions of the Granville & Districts Soccer Football Association whilst our mini, younger junior and senior mens' teams continued their affiliation with the Churches Football Association, Sydney. Decisions on team placement were again taken in consultation with team management and the club executive and will be reviewed on an annual basis in light of the changing circumstances of both our club and the Associations concerned. We would like to thank both these Associations for their support and the competition they have provided.

Unfortunately the restoration work on our fields at Granville Park were not very successful and we stayed "up the hill" for training. The lack of soccer posts is a problem and we have raised this with Cumberland Council. This led to the late erection of posts on field 5 and promises for posts on field 2 next season. Many thanks to Councillor Hamed for her support.

In 2019 CFA Sydney celebrated its Centenary. With new Perpetual Trophies for six a side and a celebration Dinner in August. Many of our club members attended the dinner which was a great night with plenty of memoribillia, a video display and guest speakers David Hill and Paul Wade.

This season we had two former players make international debuts. Mohammed Rahimi has now played 4 games for Afghanistan and has embarked on World Cup Qualification games for 2022. Martin Lo debuted for the Vietnam U23s against Myanmar and will attempt Olympic Qualification for 2020.

On field success was everywhere in 2019. The All Age Ladies, Premier Reserves, U16/1, U12/4 and U9 Onyx teams were all minor premiers. In Grand Finals we won the Premier Reserves, U16/1, U12/4, U11 and U9 trophies. For the first time we had teams qualify for the Football NSW Champions of Champions competitons. The competition is for the winning Division 1 teams from across the state. This is an incredible achievement and a great honour. Our U12 Girls made it to the Quarter Finals before going down on penalties after a 2-2 draw in normal time.

The Premier League boys regained the State Cup Knockout trophy winning it for the third time in four years. Both of our U6s and the 7 Whites played knockout semis but lost close games. On six a side day we had another very successful day, claiming a number of the new Perpetual Trophies and being named the Bill and Meryn Palmer Club Champions. We won 6 competitions – U11 (Red), 12 Girls, 13, 15, 16, AAL and the B Grade AAM. We were also runners up in 7 competitions with the U9 (Red), U10, U11 Girls, U14 and U16 where we finished first and second!

In 2019 the National Titles for 14s, 16s, 16s Girls, 18s, 23s, AAL and AAM were again hosted by Queensland and McCredie was represented in the NSW City sides by Mahmoud Jalloh and Muhammed Alizada (U18), Darren Warren, Theo Thoo, Daison Le, Peter Hourani (U23), Wil Wark & Yousuf Almaroof (AAM), Sharlene Muru-Tucker, Jenna Nowlan, and Destiny Joseph (AAL) and Greg Wark (coach AAM) Congratulations to all. The U16s and the U23s went all the way winning their grandfinals.

The club's executive was elected in November and I would like to thank all the committee, Peter W, Tahlia, Dorothy, Carolynne, Ian, Hendrika, Sarah, Elise, Ahmad and Wil for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. If everybody brings a friend we will double our team numbers!



Some of our senior and 23s players enjoying their breakfast at Nationals.







Under 7 Red Team Report








Words from the Coach






Ali K ran hard and passed some good balls this season, playing mostly mid field positions and feeding through balls. Well done Ali!

• Mohammad - First year with our team. Mohammad didn't have the chance to play more than 2-3 games but he always showed strong support to all his team mates where ever position he played.







Renee the 'bulldog' chased everything down and won the ball back. She rescued the team many times.




Sebastian


Our forwards, Jayson and Omar were always a threat and kept us in top 5 through the season.


One of the season's highlights was watching our U15 team take the annual six a side trophy in a very tough final.

Under 16 Division 1 Team Report








