Despite all these difficulties, as the season continued a number of our teams went from strength to strength and by the end of the season we had 9 teams competing in Grand Finals and we won 7 of them. These outstanding results made 2020 one of Guildford McCredie's most successful seasons to date, however more important than these results was witnessing the McCredie Soccer club spirit which continued to shine through each week being constantly encouraged by the dedication of our coaches and managers.

I would also like to take this opportunity to recognise and give a big thankyou to Greg and Carolynne for the tremendous amount of time and effort they always put in behind the scenes but especially during this difficult season, organising player registrations, new gear, teams, coaches and managers not to mention having to constantly deal with the ever changing Covid restrictions and compliance issues.

Sadly the Covid restrictions also meant that there was no Six-a-Side competition or National Titles this year and now we can't even hold our annual presentation night but on a positive note things will hopefully get back to some sort of normality by next season.

In closing I would like to thank our Club Committee members who continued to fulfill their roles despite mostly having to meet via "Zoom" and all the parents, relatives and supporters for your support, understanding and co-operation during the season.

I wish you all the best during the summer, enjoy the holiday season and I hope to see you all again in 2021.



## Secretary's Report

This was a season like no other. I would like to congratulate every committee member, coach, manager, player and parent for your patience this season and your perseverance in seeing the season through. Many of our neighbouring clubs lost significant numbers of teams in the leadup to the season through the Covid health crisis uncertainty and many others were not able to get their teams through to the end of the season. Between our registration days in February and the eventual season start in July we at McCredie lost 64 registered players. They signed up – but withdrew (many without even informing us!) But we did not lose a single team thanks to the patience and persistence of our wonderful coaches, managers and committee. This was an extraordinary effort.

In Guildford McCredie Uniting Soccer Club's twenty-second season we were able to field six junior teams: one each in the Under 11, 12, 13, 14, 16 and 17 age groups; nine small sided teams: two under 8s, two under 9s, three under 10s, U8-10 Girls and an U11-13 Girls; four mini teams, two under 6s and two under 7s; two senior men's teams in the Premier League and Premier Reserve competitions and an All Age Ladies team – a total of 22 teams. This is three teams less than last season.

It was fantastic to see CFA Sydney expand their Saturday girl's competitions. Unfortunately Covid saw the withdrawal of nearly half of the originally registered teams. It was pleasing to see the competitions push ahead regardless with plans in 2021 for expansion and U14, U12 and U10 girl's comps.

Covid impacted throughout the season with the cancellation of our trial gala days (which were all set up ready to go against Bass Hill, AC United, Lidcombe and Beecroft), six a side, John Oliver junior rep shields, GDSFA knockouts, our lapathon, Champions of Champions, Marconi Stadium for the finals and National Titles. It is a



miracle that CFA got the State Cup in and that the semi final series was able to go ahead. In an unlucky year – we got lucky there.

It was great to get soccer posts back on our training fields this year and again we would like to thank Councillor Hamed for her support.

Despite the delayed start McCredie managed plenty of on field success. And what about grand final day – we won 7 of the 8 grand finals we competed in! The U8-11 Girls, U9 White, U10 Onyx, U11-13 Girls and U14 were all minor premiers – the U10 Onyx were undefeated. In Grand Finals the U9 Red, U10 Onyx, U8-11 Girls, U11, U11-13 Girls and U17 were all victorious. Also on grand final day the U7 Whites defeated U7 Red in the final and the U6 Whites were runners up. Additionally the U8 Whites, U10 Red, U12/4s, U13, U16, AAL/3 and Premier League all qualified for their respective semi finals.

The club's executive was elected in November and I would like to thank all the committee, Peter W, Tahlia, Dorothy, Carolynne, Ian, Hendrika, Sarah, Elise, Mabel and Wil for the support and work they did during the year. Remember – no one is paid for their service to your club.

Don't forget that the registration days are the first two Saturdays in February at Granville Park between 9am and 11am. All registrations must be accompanied by full fees. If everybody brings a friend we will double our team numbers!

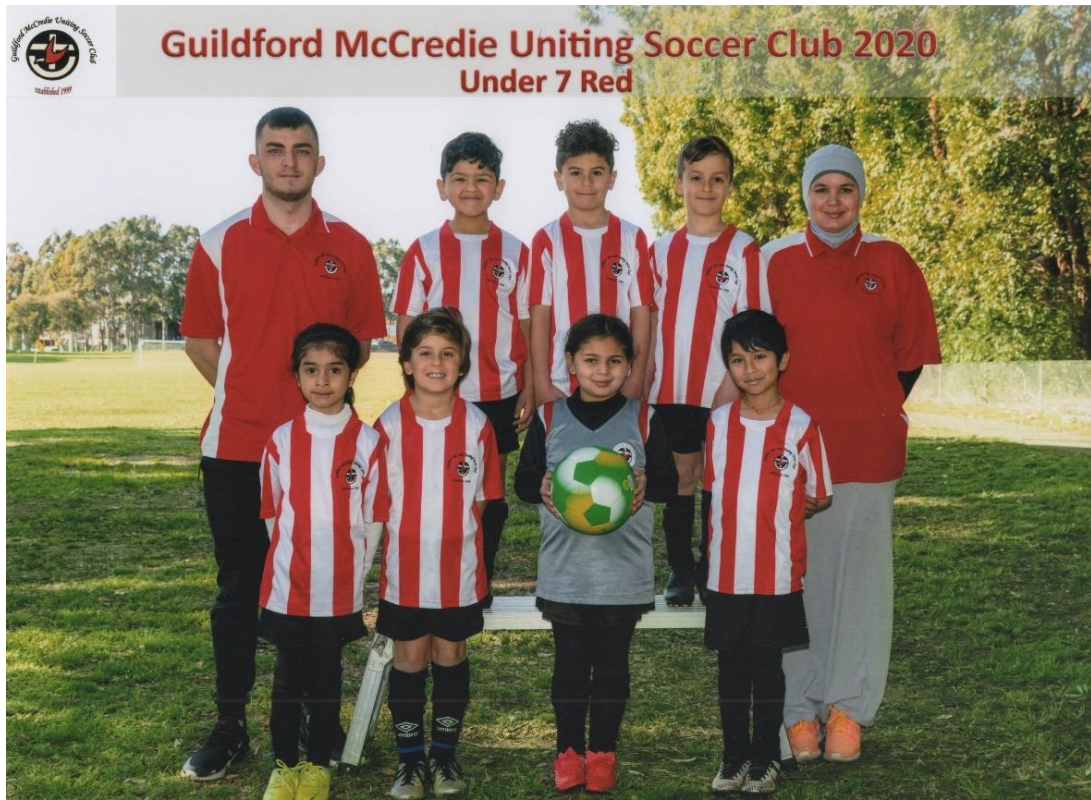
## Under 6 White Team Report

## Under 8-10 Girls Team Report

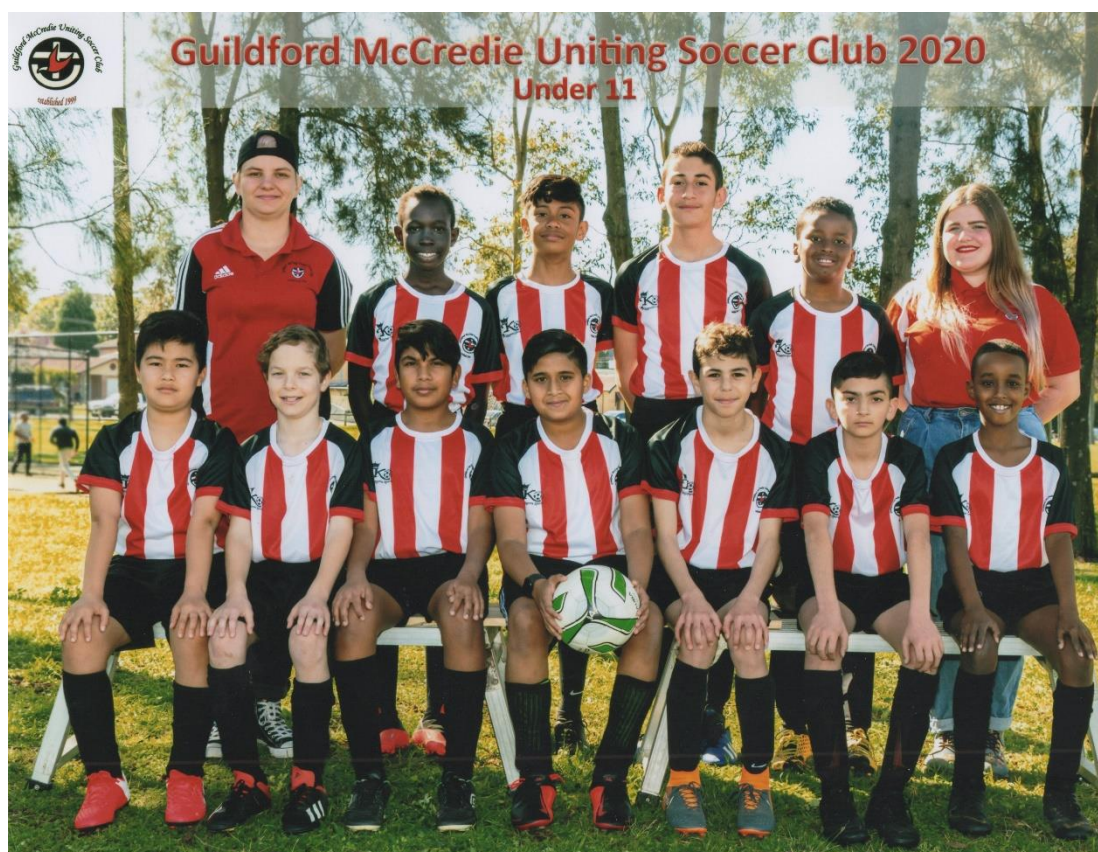

### **Zienat**

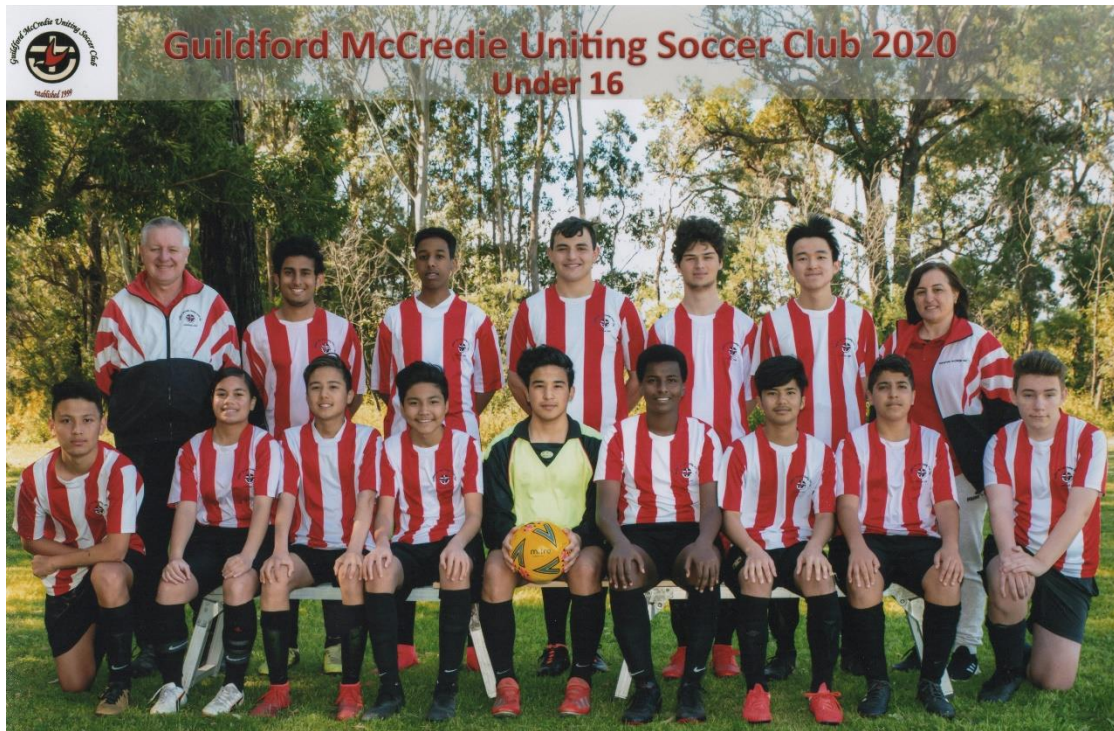

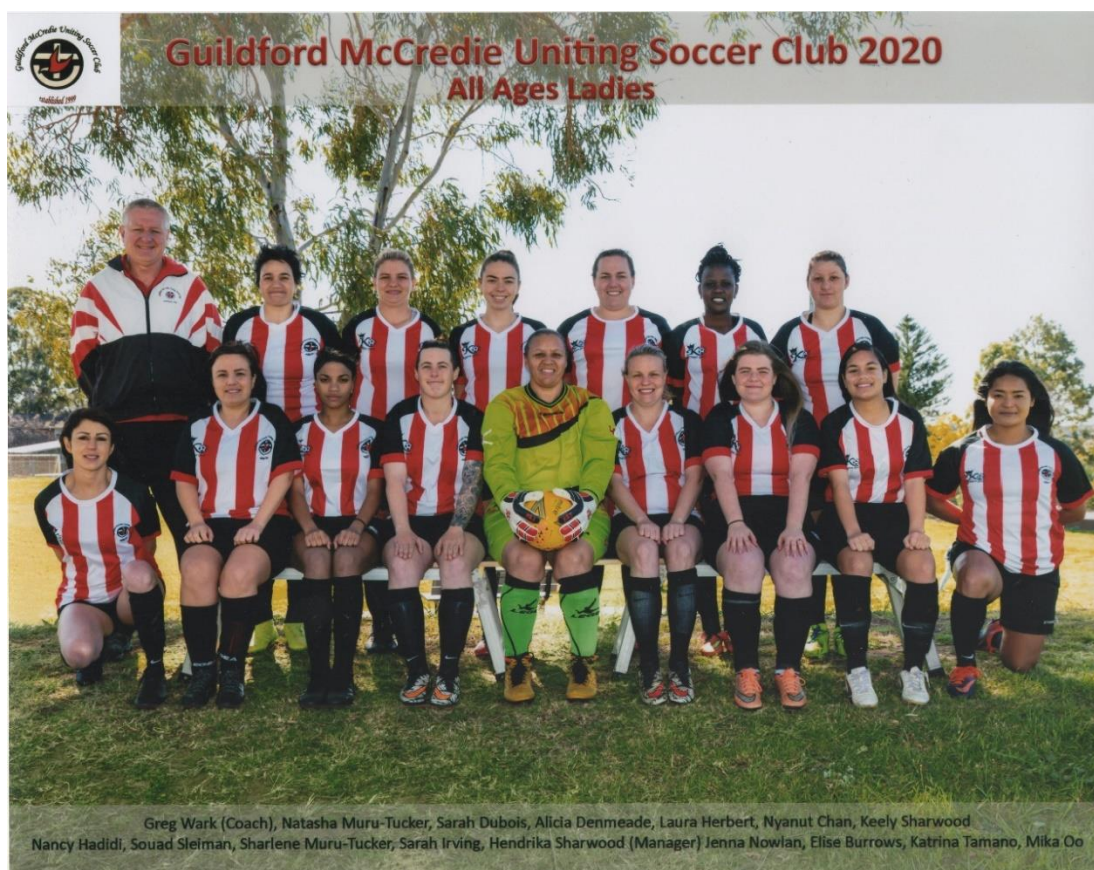
